Person or event commemorated: Sir William Fettes (1750-1836) was a very successful Edinburgh merchant and underwriter, twice elected Lord Provost of Edinburgh (in 1800 and 1805), who created a trust fund in 1830 which was used in 1864 to found Fettes College. (The College was opened in 1870.)

History of Commission: The Fettes Trust Ledger records two payments to John Steell: £50 on 26 June 1874 'to account for bust of Sir William Fettes' (1), and £55 on 3 June 1875, the 'balance of account for bust of Sir William Fettes' (2).
