Notes from second visit: The line of the lade could still be discerned until about 2005 when the local authority felled the row of mature poplar trees that indicated the position of the lade. This part of the lane runs through public open space. Parts of this open space have, and still are, subjected to holding water on the surface in wet weather. The mill lade is shown on the 1st edition OS but not however the weir which is still visible today. The take off point for the lade from the weir is also still visible.
