**Project Description** Watching Brief

## Report

A watching brief was undertaken on the 8th September 1997 during the excavation of foundation trenches for the provision of steel benches. One bench was located a third of the way up the hill on the E side beside the new footpath, with the second bench placed inside the castle courtyard against the W face of the perimeter wall.

## TRENCH 1

This trench was laid out on an area of backfill inside the courtyard S of the entrance through the E perimeter wall, and measured 2m N-S x 1m E-W. The trench was excavated to a depth of only 0.05m, involving the removal of turf alone. The trench was photographed nonetheless, and levels were even taken.

## TRENCH 2/3

Two small trenches were opened to take the founds for the lower bench, measuring  $0.7 \times 0.25 \text{m} \times 0.30 \text{m}$  in depth, and lying side by side. In both trenches, 0.15 m of turf and topsoil removed onto 0.15 m of light brown soil and dolerite fragments, the bedrock at this point lying close to the surface. No finds were made, and the trenches were photographed.
