Description	<p>The Maiden Stone is a block of phonolite, split from the exposed bedrock to its NE leaving a narrow gap in between. It measures 4.2m in length from NW to SE by 0.65m in breadth and up to 1.4m in height. The rock, which bears graffiti on its NE face, is depicted on the 1st edition of the OS 6-inch map (Haddingtonshire Sheet 10, 1855) and the OS surveyors noted that 'A traditional story is told and believed by the country people that no woman except the[y] be a virgin can pass between these rocks...' (OS Name Book No. 42 p17 see also p64)</p>

Quarry

Description

The large quarry that removed much of the NE end of Traprain Law closed in 1975 (Hunter 2003, 252) and only vestiges of the tracks and buildings that serviced it remain. At its maximum extent, the quarry measured about 240m from ENE to WSW by about 145m transversely and the face at the rear rises to about 45m, the total depth of the quarry being about 70m.
The quarry was considerably smaller when it was depicted on the 1st edition of the OS 6-inch map (Haddingtonshire 1855 sheet 10) annotated as a sandstone quarry and it was

Description Two probable house-platforms are situated on the unimproved slope that lies immediately below the steep crags that form the SE flank of Traprain Law. The larger (SW) platform is oval and measures up to 35m from NE to SW by 10m transversely within a rear scarp up to 4m in height and a front apron along the crest of which is a line of edge-set boulders. This was surveyed by RCAHMS in 1955, as was a band of stone along the SE edge of the NE terrace, which is now difficult to trace (HES: DP250013). Description	<p>A stone-lined spring is situated on the N flank of Traprain Law within the fort, and 130m NNW of the summit. It is marked by a natural bedrock fissure about 1.2m in diameter and 0.5m in depth. An excavation undertaken in 2000 (MS726/198, Trench 9) provided evidence that the spring once had some form of cap and that a culvert had been created carrying water to the north.
